#### Prime Minister's participation in the Quad Leaders' Summit in Tokyo





Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi participated in the second in-person Quad Leaders' Summit in Tokyo, Japan on 24 May 2022, along with Prime Minister Fumio Kishida of Japan, President Joseph Biden of the United States of America and Prime Minister Anthony Albanese of Australia. This was the fourth interaction of the Leaders since their first virtual meeting in March 2021, the Summit in Washington D.C in September 2021 and their virtual interaction in March 2022.

The Leaders reiterated their shared commitment to a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific and the importance of upholding the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity and peaceful resolution of disputes. They exchanged perspectives on developments in the Indo-Pacific and the conflict in Europe. Prime Minister highlighted India's consistent and principled position on the need for cessation of hostilities, resumption of dialogue and diplomacy. The Leaders also took stock of ongoing Quad collaboration and their vision for the future.

#### Prime Minister Modi visit to Germany

In their opening remarks, both leaders highlighted key aspects of the bilateral relationship as well as shared perspectives on regional and global issues. Prime Minister emphasized that India-Germany partnership could serve as an example of success in a complex world. He also invited German participation in India's Atmanirbhar Bharat campaign.








Prime Minister @narendramodi held talks with PM @katrinjak of Iceland. They discussed boosting ties in areas like trade, energy, fisheries and more.







The Summit provided an opportunity to review the progress of the India-Nordic relations since the 1st India-Nordic Summit, which was held in 2018 in Stockholm. Discussions were held on multilateral cooperation in post-pandemic economic recovery, climate change, sustainable development, innovation, digitalization, and green and clean growth.

### Prime Minister's meeting with President of France Emmanuel Macron



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi paid an official visit to France on May 4, 2022 on his way back from the 2nd India-Nordic Summit in Copenhagen.

In Paris, Prime Minister met H.E. Mr. Emmanuel Macron, President of France, in oneon-one and delegation level formats. The two leaders held discussions on the entire range of bilateral issues, including cooperation in defence, space, blue economy, civil nuclear and people-to-people ties.

#### India retains top spot as fastest-growing major economy: UN report



According to the UN, India will be the fastest-growing major economy this fiscal year, with economic growth estimated at 6.4%. China, the world's second-fastest expanding big economy, is expected to grow by 4.5% this year and 5.2% next year. The United States is expected to rise by 2.6% this year and 1.8% the next year. Chief of the UN's Global Economic Monitoring Branch Mr. Hamid Rashid said that he expects Indian recovery will be strong in the short-term. When asked about India's stronger economic performance and prospects in comparison to the other major nations he attributed it to lower inflation, which does not necessitate as much monetary tightening as many of the other countries. Last fiscal year, India's economy grew by 8.8% the report said. The IMF predicted an 8.2% growth rate in 2021-22, whereas the World Bank predicted 8%.

## India's Pharma exports grow by 103% since 2013-14



Since 2013-14, Indian pharmaceutical exports have increased by 103 %, from Rs. 90,415 crores (US\$ 11.82 billion) in 2013-14 to Rs. 1,83,422 crores (US\$ 23.98 billion) in 2021-22. The Pharma Sector's export performance in 2021-22 was the best it has ever been.

Exports have increased by about US\$ 10 billion in the last eight years, which is a fantastic achievement. Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution and Textiles, Mr. Piyush Goyal stated that under the active leadership of Prime Minister, Mr. Narendra Modi India has been serving as the 'pharmacy of the world'. With 60% of the world's vaccines and 20% of generic medications coming from India, Indian pharmaceutical businesses have established a global imprint, owing to their price competitiveness and high quality. India is the world's third-largest producer by volume and the fourteenth-largest producer by value.


World-class manufacturing competence, robust infrastructure, cost-competitiveness, trained human resources, and innovation are the driving forces behind India's pharma success story. The Indian pharmaceutical sector is currently valued at roughly US\$ 50 billion. Pharmaceuticals and drugs account for 5.92% of our global exports.

Formulations and biologicals continue to contribute to the majority of our overall exports, accounting for 73.31%, followed by bulk medicines and drug intermediates, which accounted for US\$ 4437.64 million in exports. The United States, the United Kingdom, South Africa, Russia, and Nigeria are India's top five pharmaceutical export destinations.

It's also worth noting that about 55% of Indian pharmaceutical exports go to highly regulated markets. The prescription market in the United States and Europe is dominated by Indian pharmaceutical companies. India has the most FDA-approved plants outside of the United States.

#### India sees birth of its 100th unicorn, total valuation reaches \$332.7bn



With Neobank Open being the country's 100th unicorn, India's unicorn wave has reached an all-time high. According to the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, one out of every ten unicorns born globally was born in India. With the recent fundraising of US\$ 50 million from IIFL and current investors, neobank startup OPEN becomes India's 100th unicorn. As of May 5th, the Indian Startup Ecosystem, which is the third-largest in the world in terms of unicorns, has 100 unicorns with a total valuation of US\$ 332.7 billion.

According to the Ministry, 14 unicorns worth US\$ 18.9 billion were born in India during the first four months of 2022. The year 2021 saw a significant increase in the number of unicorns, with 44 firms joining the club during the course of the year, with a combined valuation of US\$ 93 billion. Until fiscal year 2016-17, approximately one unicorn was added per year. This figure has been expanding exponentially over the last four years (from FY 2017-18), with a whopping 66% Year-on-Year growth in the number of additional unicorns introduced each year.


Furthermore, according to ministry data, more than 69,000 startups have been recognised in the country since the inception of the Startup India initiative on January 16, 2016. We have identified startups solving problems in 56 varied areas, including 13% from IT services, 9% from healthcare and life sciences, 7% from education, 5% from professional and commercial services, 5% agricultural, and 5% food and drinks.
